Studiebeurse

Voorlopige uitslae dui daarop dat 37 uit 39 beursstudente sal slaag.

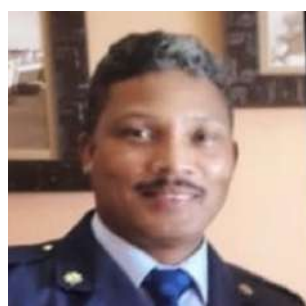

Skoolprogram

Die Trust wou in 2020 'n program in leerverryking by Wagenhuiskranz Primêr steun.

Toe die skool weens Covid-19 sluit, kon sy nie die program aanbied nie en het toe leerders aangespoor om deel te neem aan 'n internasionale program waarin kinders hul gevoelens oor die pandemie uitbeeld. Steun vir gemeenskapsprojekte

Die Trust het in 2020 die steun vir projekte in die gemeenskap uitgebrei. Dit sluit ook die uitbou van vaardighede en vermoens in die Vissersunie in. Die Vissersunie is 'n kritieke bestuursliggaam in die gemeenskap.

Argief

Die Trust het voortgebou aan die argief van historiese dokumente van Waenhuiskrans se geskiedenis en omgewing. In Vishuis sal die argief oop wees vir inwoners, besoekers, skoliere en studente.

Vishuis

Vishuis word steeds vertraag. Die hofaansoek vir hersiening van besluite is nie vanjaar afgehandel nie.

Befondsing vir projekte

Die Trust beveilig befondsing vir elke projek. Wanneer donateurs in die algemeen 'n skenking aan die Trust doen, besluit die trustees waar om dit tot voordeel vir die gemeenskap aan te wend. Donateurs kan ook aandui as hul geld vir 'n spesifieke projek wil skenk. Die Trust het deurlopend geld nodig om studente met beurse te steun. Die projek vir leerverryking by die skool is 'n nuwe projek waartoe donateurs kan bydra.

Finansies

In die boekjaar 2019-2020 het die Trust R665 000 regstreeks toegedeel, meesal vir beurse, asook R549 000 ter ondersteuning van projekte in die gemeenskap. In die vorige boekjaar was dié toedelings R613 000 en R104 000.

Op jaareinde het die Trust R1,4 miljoen in kontant gehad. Die grootste deel van dié bedrag is geoormerk om Vishuis te voltooi.

Toesig

Die Trust is geregistreer by die Meester van die Hooggeregshof (IT3854 / 2004); by die Departement van Gemeenskapsontwikkeling (042-478-NWO); en by die Ontvanger van Inkomste, kragtens artikels 30 en 18a van die Inkomstebelastingwet.

Die ouditeure van die Trust is PricewaterhouseCoopers Inc. (Reg No. 1998/012055/21). Die audit word gedoen volgens die vereistes van algemeen aanvaarde rekeningkundige praktyke (AARP). Die trustees is Colin Bird, André Marthinus, Ilze Baatjies, Jean Craven en Hannes van Zyl. Vivian Lourens, 'n trustee en voormalige voorsitter van die Vissersunie, is in 2020 oorlede.

Ten slotte

Die Trust steun die gemeenskap met sinryke projekte. Die trustees vertrou Vishuis sal voltooi word en ekonomiese groei in die gemeenskap stimuleer.

A REPORT ON THE CREATIVE ARTS PROJECT LAUNCHED AT WAGENHUISKRANZ PRIMARY SCHOOL - APRIL TO MAY 2020.

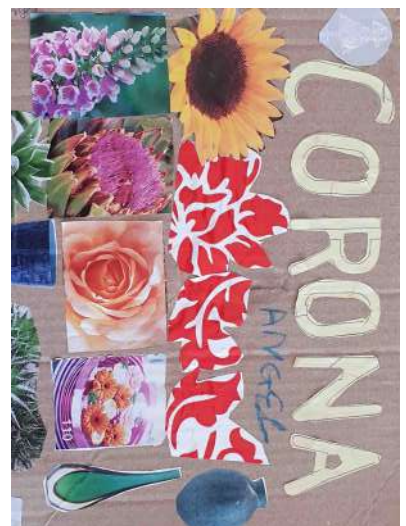
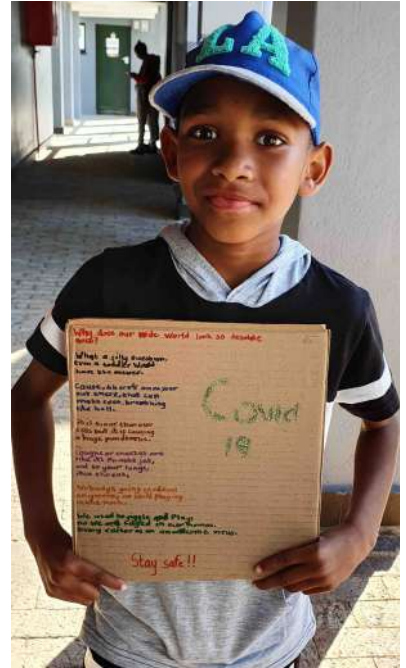
It is with much humbleness and gratitude towards the Arniston Community Development Trust (WACDT) and Mr. Andre Marthinus (school principal) that I report on the creative arts project, launched at Wagenhuiskranz Primary School during the COVID-19 LEVEL 4 lockdown. This project formed part of the International Corona Multimedia Showcase <https://coronashowcase.org/>

launched in Canada. The goal of the project was to enable children from all over the world to make their 'voices' heard about their experiences of the pandemic and to show their resilience through the expression of their creativity. Over a period of four weeks children (ages 6 to 14 years) from Kassiesbaai were provided with resources and guidelines for art activities that they could do at home. Participants received their 'art activity box' when they came to the soup kitchen and returned the project that they had made each week (see photo's attached). There were eventually 22 children who took part in the project. They each receive a certificate of participation. The main challenge was continuous communication between myself and the families because it was predominantly the children who came to the school to collect food. I would have hoped for more family engagement.

Initially before lockdown, a creative arts program was to be launched during the March and September school holidays. These two programs were to form part of the creative arts learning intervention centre being established at the school. The aim of the centre is to provide learning support to the children through the expression of their creativity (visual and performing arts). Prior to lockdown various creative arts resources were purchased from the donation of R40 000 made to the school by the WACDT. The donation enabled me to initiate the Corona Multimedia Showcase project at the school and set up the first phase of the creative arts learning centre. Hopefully in 2021 more creative arts projects can be initiated at the school. Manpower, teacher training and time constraints are some of the challenges that would need to be addressed. From the side of the children, there is curiosity and creativity in abundance!!! A friend of mine's mother, Gerda Oosthuizen, age 88 was so inspired by the children's creativity that she knitted 35 bears, hats and mittens for each child. The children will receive them on the last day of school together with their certificates.
